This occurred in the morning and early afternoon of May 4-1973-(Ac.

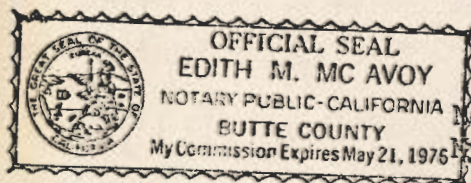

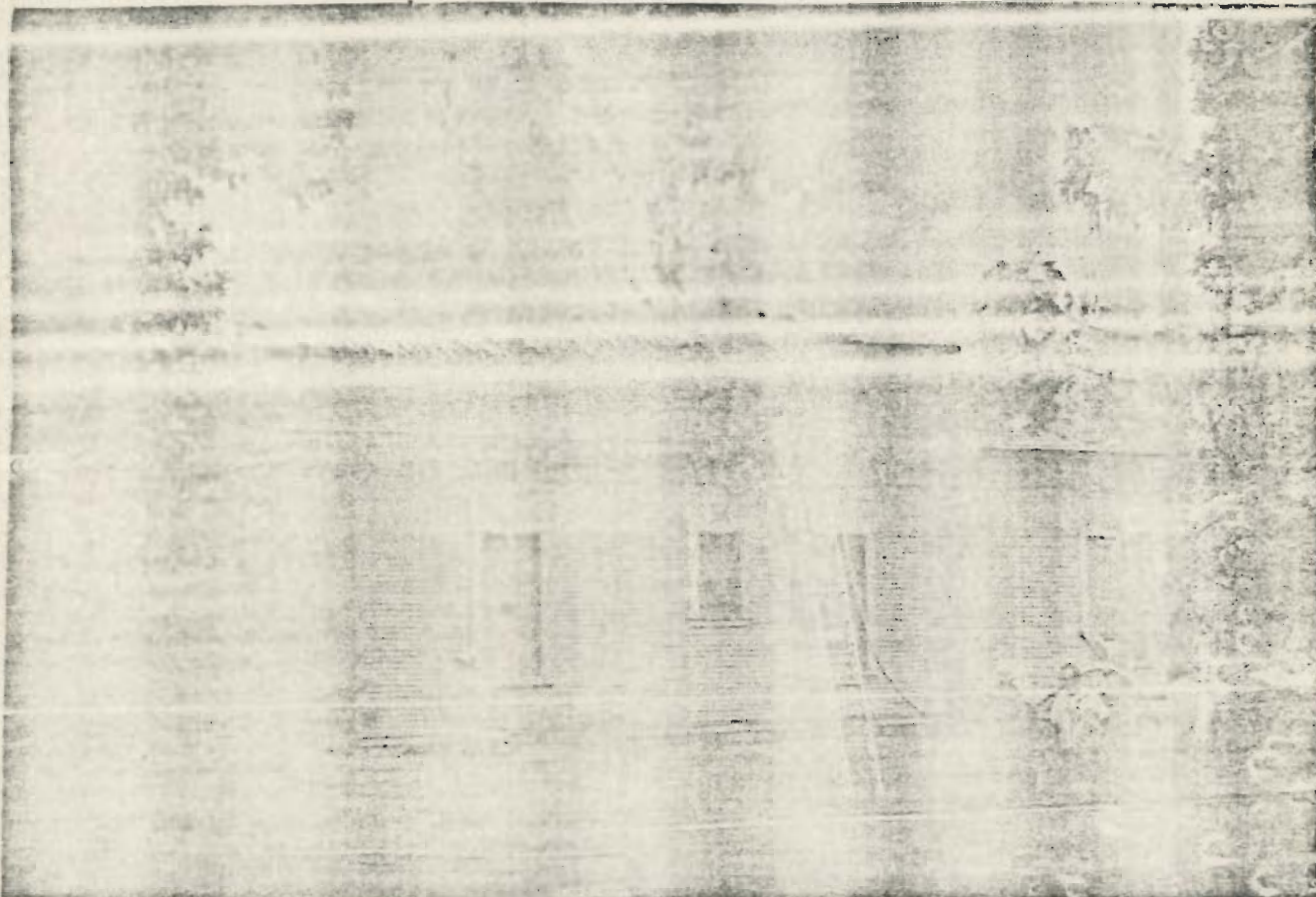
This mail arrived this morning later mail I will forward with instructions & hold for you at Cape Charles.
