Minnesota Overcomes Dallas, 23-21

DALLAS (AP)—Fred Cox kicked a 27-yard field goal with one second remaining Sunday to lift Minnesota to a 23-21 victory over the Dallas Cowboys and keep the Vikings unbeaten in the National Football League.

It was the third field goal of the day for Cox who also connected from the 46 and 30-yard lines.

Minnesota is now 4-0 and the leader in the National Conference Central Division while the Cowboys sank to 1-3 which is their worst start since 1965.

Fran Tarkenton, the crafty Viking quarterback who had thrown quarterback passes of 68 and 13 yards to Chuck Foreman earlier in the game, drove Minnesota 68 yards in the closing moments after Calvin Hill's eight-yard run had put the rallying Cowboys ahead, 21-20, with 2:26 to play.

Tarkenton scrambled for 12 yards during the drive and hit Ed Mariano with two clutch passes.
